

2016 Medical and Educational Goods and Services (MEGS) and other Donations report

To provide context to each donation provided by Pfizer to a healthcare organisation, and to make the data more meaningful to the general public, Pfizer is committed to disclosing an additional level of detail which provides a brief summary about each grant or donation; this is consistent with the format we follow for our disclosure of the support we provide to Patient Organisations. Donations are only ever paid to an entity; a donation would never be paid to an individual.

All the donations Pfizer has provided are categorised in one of the following ways:

Medical and Educational Goods and Services

Medical and Educational Goods and Services (MEGS) are provided in the form of financial grants or 'benefit in kind' services delivered by a Pfizer colleague or a 3rd party supplier engaged by Pfizer. An 'in-kind' donation, also referred to as 'gift in kind', is a type of donation which instead of giving money to buy needed goods and services, donates the actual goods and services. Examples of in-kind donations would be the donation of transport or meeting room facilities, patient information leaflets, training or professional expertise.

MEGS are intended to either enhance patient care or benefit the NHS and maintain patient care. Pfizer's involvement is strictly limited to the provision or delivery of the MEGS and Pfizer does not expect to receive any benefit in return. MEGS do not constitute an inducement to prescribe, supply, administer, recommend, buy or sell any medicine.

Charitable Donation

A Charitable Contribution is the provision of funding, equipment or free products to a charity to support public interest activities. Charitable donations are made freely, and Pfizer does not expect any direct or indirect tangible benefit in return.

Business Donation

A Business Donation is the provision of funding, equipment or free products to an entity which isn't a charity (e.g. hospitals or institutions) to support public interest activities. Business donations are made freely, and Pfizer does not expect any direct or indirect tangible benefit in return.

Studentship

Through studentships, graduates undertake a research project to gain a PhD diploma. Pfizer does not directly fund students, but provides a number of grants every year to universities to support PhD Studentships.

Educational Grant

An Educational Grant is funding provided by Pfizer to an entity to support a bona fide, independent educational program in areas of interest to Pfizer, such as medical science or public health policy, where the primary purpose of the support is the provision of such legitimate educational program and not an opportunity to promote Pfizer's products, brands or business.
